Camp Hill *An Urban Oasis*

In this mature tree-lined development is an oasis created by a mix of cottage garden perennials, native plants, and the gardener's love of ornamental grasses.

Lemoyne *Quoth the Raven, Never Mow*

This garden has been transformed from a typical suburban lawn into a "no-mow" cottage garden using sustainable gardening techniques to provide wildlife habitat.

Haven on a Hill

Situated on a slope and surrounded by streets, this private haven includes a large herb garden, a pond, a rose-covered pergola and an eclectic mix of "repurposed" ornaments.

An Artful Garden

This four-season garden features contemporary art in the landscape with late spring lilies and irises, water gardens, and a Japanese maple collection set against a wooded backdrop.

Rain Gardens on Market Street

Outside Dippin Dairy, view an example of this innovative and attractive streetscape designed to mitigate storm water runoff into the Susquehanna River.

Mechanicsburg *A Veritable Backyard Habitat*

In this small space, but big garden, with paths of brick, stone, and grass, efficient utilization of a compact area supplies abundant habitat for nature's creatures.

Classic Farmhouse Gardens

The gardens surrounding this classic Pennsylvania farmhouse include a formal pool area with cottage charm; a welcoming shade garden; and a vegetable and herb garden.

This & That for Sun & Shade

Follow the shady path to the sitting area overlooking a faerie garden before exploring the sunny mixed border, small vegetable garden, herb garden, and a new fire pit garden.

A Wet and Wild Garden

Delight in a topiary rabbit, a container-filled terrace, a mix of native, tropical, and perennial plants, and a pond filled with plants, fish, frogs, and other wildlife.

Trails & Trees Center

Mechanicsburg Middle School students maintain native and butterfly gardens around this community pavilion that provides a great view of the Mechanicsburg vale.

Williamsburg Garden

This student garden at Upper Allen Elementary School, originally dedicated in 1999, had fallen into disrepair but was renovated in 2006 and continues as a teaching garden for 5th grade Green Team students with the help of Penn State Master Gardeners.
